Great achievements often involve overcoming challenges. This question helps employers evaluate how you **tackle problems, take initiative**, and go above and beyond expectations.

5. To Learn What Motivates You

What you consider your "greatest achievement" also reveals your **values**, **priorities**, **and career motivations**. Do you pride yourself on teamwork, innovation, or persistence? Your answer says a lot about what drives you professionally.

Your answer gives them insight into how you'll perform in the new role and whether you'll add value to the team.

How to Answer: Use the STAR Method

The **STAR Method** is the most effective way to structure your answer:

- **S** Situation: Describe the context
- **T** Task: Explain the challenge or responsibility
- A Action: Describe what steps you took
- **R** Result: Highlight the outcome with measurable results
